


The centenial book on the Terraces will come out in June 2012.

Important Gas Shut-off Valve Information

In less than 10 minutes, you can locate your external gas shut-off valve and make sure that it can be reached. If you can't locate the 11-inch diameter access lid that is generally in the sidewalk, or within four feet thereof, let me know (415barnyard@gmail.com). It is important to verify that the actual shut-off valve can be seen and is not covered with dirt.







One of these photos shows a valve access "box" with the lid removed. In this case the valve was clearly visible and could be tested. In the other photo is a lid that has obviously not been lifted off for a very long time. In this latter case, the valve could be covered by a foot or more of soil and the resulting delay to reach the shut-off could be a problem if a gas leak was detected in the home.

So, please, for your own safety, go out and make sure you can access the shut-off valve.

Note:There are some exceptions to the above, and if you cannot locate your external PG&E gas shut-off valve cover and valve, a member of the ITHA NERT team will help. In some cases, you will need to contact PG&E for assistance.

Greetings Neighbor!

This year brings Ingleside Terraces our CENTENNIAL!!! The Terraces are 100 years YOUNG. Spring is the time of year when the ITHA starts the Annual Membership Drive. This year we are making a special plea for your Membership dollars. Membership in the ITHA has shrunk and along with the cost of gas, our expenses have increased. The major expenses are the landscaping costs and the necessary insurance policy covering the Board operations. Who can argue with the sight of our well-maintained green areas? The attendance at the ITHA sponsored Annual Picnic tells us that people love living in the Terraces.

In the past, we've made some cost cutting efforts like volunteers delivering **The Sundial**, our well-loved newsletter that **Linda McGilvray** oversees and produces. The news takes a fair amount of time to get the articles written, and again, we have a great group of volunteers who help with this job and keep costs down. Sandy Gandolfo and Wendy Dwyer have the big job of running our Social Committee and continue to put on our annual events. The first this year will be the GARAGE SALE, Saturday, May 19th. Then the big event of the year will be the **CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION** at the **Annual Picnic**, scheduled for Sunday, September 30. In December we gather for a holiday **SING** at the Sundial. On a sad note, the Board lost one very valuable member who passed away in December. **John Duff** was always there when any member needed his assistance. John grilled at the Picnic for years, and he kept ahead of the 'taggers' who do the graffiti. He and his wife **Patricia** were working on the bylaws and CC&R's FAQ

of the Association, which is a huge but necessary task. John's death leaves a large 'hole' in the Board structure. We are always looking for loyal neighbors who have the willingness to volunteer time. If that is YOU, please attend a meeting. One of the responsibilities I have is construction reporting to the neighbors. Working directly with the Planning Dept., ITHA keeps on top of changes in our area. The Design Review Group strives to keep personal opinions out of the conversation. We encourage conversation that results in a diverse and wonderful neighborhood.

Your Board of Directors works diligently to make sure Ingleside Terraces remains the fantastic community it has been for the past CENTURY! Feel free to attend the regular meetings which are held on the third Thursday of the month at St. Francis Church in the Guild Hall at 7:30 pm. We don't usually meet in July, August or December.

Almost every day Ruth Mellinger, 93 years old, walks from the sundial to shop on Ocean Avenue or to visit one of our two local libraries .

Last year she quit competitive tennis, but she has not slowed her many hours weekly as a volunteer at Laguna Honda Hospital. She has been a volunteer there for 35 years and also volunteered at Shriners hospital on 19th Avenue until it closed.

Though Ruth gets around so much, she is hard to spot at five feet tall and 90 active pounds.

Ruth lives alone in an immaculate white home on Entrada Ct., two houses north of the sundial. She says she loves living independently but misses her husband George, whom she married in 1937. George died in 1996. She adores their six children, 72 to 52, 13 grand-children, and 7 great grandchildren.

Ocean Avenue Assn. Update

Catherine Hickey, the new Executive Director of the Ocean Avenue Association, has brought us up to date with some facts and observations regarding Ocean Avenue:

"Now that we have, for the most part, the organization up and running, I am looking forward to turning my attention to some of the larger issues. One of the top priorities for next year is to conduct a comprehensive retail study – residents, students, businesses, property owners and other community stakeholders, to learn more about the wants and needs for Ocean Avenue. From there, create a short/long term plan for business attraction and retention, streetscape improvements and marketing/promotion. The ultimate goal is for Ocean to get back to the place where it's a destination for all of our residents."

There are some new businesses in the works:

CVS (1770 Ocean) should be done with build out by mid-April.

Chase Bank is supposed to begin breaking ground shortly.

Champa Garden (613 Faxon) is an Asian fusion restaurant, which should be open this summer. Whole Foods.

Sherwin Williams is opening at 1415 Ocean Avenue.

As for safety on the avenue:

"We have a Public Safety Committee that meets regularly. We recently met with SFSafe, and we are in the beginning stages of creating a Business Watch. Business owners elect block captains, and have a phone tree. With a support structure in place businesses can communicate crime issues on the street with one another. This has proved to be an effective strategy in other districts in the city."

And finally, Ms. Hickey views on how traffic will be impacted after the Whole Foods store is completed: "In all likelihood there will be some impact on traffic. The good news is the plans show parking (bike and car) located under the buildings as part of the new Brighton Street plan. There are new traffic lights going up along Ocean that will help with traffic calming. The re-construction of the Phelan Loop will help commuters get around easier. Ultimately, we will all have to wait and see."
