President's Letter

Welcome to our Holiday issue. It has been a very busy year for ITHA. This past September many of you enjoyed one of our most successful Sundial Picnics. The weather was perfect, the food everyone brought was delicious and our new tents coordinated by board member Eileen Ambre were the perfect compliment to the spread. A special thank you goes to Whole Foods, that not only provided great prices on their hot dogs and burgers, but gave us a generous gift certificate as well! Kudos go to Wendy Dwyer and Sandy Gandolfo for orchestrating a great event along with those neighbors who assisted in the setup and tear down. You won't want to miss it next year!

Some of you may have heard or sighted a visit by one of the City's coyotes recently. As I wrote in the last issue, this problem is still being pursued. Mary Paglieri and I presented a comprehensive proactive coyote wildlife management plan to Supervisor Yee and his staff last month. The goal of the plan presented in this 25-page researched and cited document is to stop further coyote migration into our neighborhoods and to minimize coyote-human/pet conflicts. Specifically, this plan will ensure coyotes stay in their natural home ranges through active habitat management. Where these home ranges overlap with human-pet spaces — conflict will be minimized through enhanced buffer zones. New home ranges will not be created by dispersing or traversing coyotes through use of deterring techniques. The coyotes' role in restoring our native ecosystem and biodiversity will be exploited in lieu of removing trees and ground cover for grasses as proposed by the Native Areas Program. Next steps are to get the Board of Supervisors' support by presenting the plan more widely. As Norman Yee has been re-elected, this process should not be delayed.

As you read this, we will have had our Annual Meeting on November 19th. Unfortunately, I was not able to attend due to returning from a business conference in Germany. I wish to thank Sandy for stepping in and taking my place. This oncea-year meeting is important and if you did not attend, please try and do so next year. Not only is it an opportunity to meet your board and fellow neighbors, but it is your opportunity to provide feedback on how we are doing and can improve going into the future. This is also the meeting where the annual budget is presented and approved so you can see where your dues are going. I am pleased to report that we are financially stable and now have funds for neighborhood projects such as landscaping our new traffic circles and replacing plantings in others. Finally, we hold elections to the board and also seek volunteers for the various committees. Please contact me at president@ithasf.org if you have some




