President's Letter

It's holiday time; however, if you were at any of our events in October, you know we got an early start. Our Octoberfest-themed annual picnic was a great success as you can see in the pictures here and on our website beautifully taken by Judy Reynolds. In a reprise of last year's event, the weather was perfect, music by Mark Goldstein and his band was engaging and everyone brought great dishes to share. Special thanks to Sandy Gandolfo and Anna Barbagelata of BARB Co. for again providing the meat and contributing to our beer barrel. Wendy Dwyer and her volunteers once again did a spectacular job.

It was only two weeks later that we had our Annual Meeting where once again Sandy and Anna provided a great Chinese lunch. Those present heard how busy we on the board have been this past year working on your behalf. This is also the time you elect a portion of your ITHA Board for 3 year terms. This year there were 5 seats up for election. Four decided to stand for reelection, Sandy Gandolfo, Thom Buchanan, Linda McGilvray and Chris Murriel. Long-time board member and contributor, Eileen Ambre, decided to provide an opportunity for others and Colleen Carrigan took it. All were elected unanimously. We thank Eileen for her years of service and look forward to Colleen's participation and ideas.

Affordable housing has replaced coyotes as the topic for the year and likely will be for next year as well. Many politician's feel that the answer is ADU's or Junior ADU's within single-family zoned neighborhoods. "Auxiliary Dwelling Unit" is the modern term for in-law or granny units. The distinction is that instead of only one within the existing residence, they are advocating for multiple — including in backyards where there is no street access except via the home. ADU's have been legal in San Francisco for a few years; however, they have not been generally attractive for homeowners, since the home permanently becomes two units, is reassessed and placed under rent control. The result is a decrease in overall property value for resale since the designation cannot be undone.

Fortunately, there are community members, including Supervisor Yee and myself, who believe there is a better approach. As I introduced in the last newsletter, the Westside has its own residential needs for seniors and young

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families. Instead of approaching the problem with a "one size fits all" wherever approach or a broad state-wide brushing away of local control, there is an alternative that is both planned and does not require up-zoning. Specific area plans for our already multi-family-zoned transit corridors if implemented would allow for community input and very specific block-by-block development appropriate to adjoining neighborhoods. In addition, they would take into account the capacity in water, electricity, sewage, transit, emergency and police services, which we know will not be enhanced any time soon. Many of you have heard that the "Westside must provide their fair share"; however, this is a false choice as we can only provide to the extent of infrastructure limitations. We all know how at capacity we've been with sewage. The many years of street work we've endured has not been to increase capacity but to simply meet and maintain our existing capacity.

While, space here precludes presenting the details of the work done thus far, I can report that there is an active cross-westside group organized by the West of Twin Peaks Council and working with Sup. Yee's office, SF Planning and Public Utilities Commission (PUC) to map out this planning process and initially identify the areas than can absorb new housing within existing multi-family zoning and within our infrastructure capacity. I will update our website with information as we move forward. If you would like to participate in this proactive planning process, please contact me at president@ithasf.org.

To ring in the holiday cheer, we have a new host for our Caroling Party this year. Fellow board member and our "neighborhood beautification guy," John Stacey, has graciously opened his home (25 Cerritos) to those of you who love to ring in the holidays with song. As usual, we'll meet at the Sundial on Sunday, Dec. 15 at 6:30 PM.

Lemonade is a counter service restaurant just outside of the West Portal MUNI station offering a variety of salads, sandwiches, and hot food options to accompany their refreshing lemonade. Their website states "Eating your vegetables shouldn't feel like punishment". While their fresh salads and hot side dishes will please any vegetarian, the sandwiches and the braised meats provide a good contrast for your favorite carnivore.

I've never voted a straight party ticket so I'm not afraid to mix and match all of the above and in fact they encourage it. One can also order items individually.


