President's Letter

Welcome to our ITHA Summer newsletter. Much has happened since our Spring issue. Our first ITHA Beautification Day was a great success. Many thanks to John Stacey, who is both a board member and Landscape Committee chair, for coordinating the day as well as all who participated. We hope this can become a regular event. See John's article for details. We had another successful ITHA Garage Sale with almost 20 neighbors participating. Thank you Social Committee, led by Wendy Dwyer and Sandy Gandolfo, for once again delivering a smoothly running event. Of course this committee has not completed its yearly work, as in a few weeks they will be putting on the ITHA Annual Sundial Picnic on Sunday, Oct. 1st from noon to 3pm. Each year this event is getting better and we look forward to meeting all of our new neighbors as well as reconnect with our long-timers.

Speaking of the Sundial, it gives me great pleasure to announce the creation of the Werthimer Sundial Park Restoration fund. This has been started by the family of Jerry and Pat Werthimer in celebration of their 70th wedding anniversary and their over 50 years of residing on Entrada Ct. and supporting the neighborhood. Their children, Jenny and Dan and their families have generously donated \$1000 to start the fund which the ITHA Board is matching. Take a moment to read about this wonderful ITHA family in this issue. The restoration plans initially include repainting the Sundial, re-cutting its dedication date in its marble base and cleaning up the landscaping. We also encourage anyone who would like to donate as well to do so using the included envelope.

Now that the drought is over, many of you may have been surprised to find coyote's visiting us again not in a good way. While the drought was a major cause, the removal of habitat is as well. This has been occurring in areas such as Stern Grove, as the Rec And Park Dept. has cleared underbrush and blackberry bushes (also a coyote food source). This too will occur with the recently approved Natural Areas Program. Removal of habitat was called out as a major contributor to conflict in the Coyote Habitat Conservation and Modification Plan presented by Mary Pagliari and myself last Fall to Supervisor Norman Yee and staff and earlier this year to the Rec

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and Park Dept. Unfortunately, the City is still in its “evaluating” stage while continuing to remove habitat. If you support a non-lethal proactive approach to resolving this ongoing issue, I encourage you to let Supervisor Yee know at Norman.Yee@sfgov.org before a more tragic incident occurs.

Finally, I am sure you are aware that the Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program is an essential component to disaster preparedness. I am pleased to report that Thom Buchanan has volunteered to lead ITHA’s part and has become certified. He is looking to reconstitute our team, so if you would like to join him in this vital activity please contact him at nert@ithasf.org. See you at the picnic and bring your favorite dish and appetites!

Long-time Terraces residents Jerry and Patricia Werthimer are celebrating their 70th wedding anniversary August 21. Their family and ITHA are honoring them with a special gift of a restoration fund for the Sundial Park.

The Werthimers were married in Chicago in 1947. Jerry earned his Doctorate in Journalism from Northwestern University, then, securing a teaching position at SF State University, moved the family here in 1960. Their charming home on Entrada was bought with a sealed bid in an auction for \$29,000. Patricia taught as a reading specialist in the Pacifica public schools, and then taught computers at SFUSD. Their children, Jenny and Dan, loved playing with the neighborhood children and attended Commodore Sloat, Aptos, Lowell and Lick-Wilmerding schools. Jerry was Journalism professor and advisor to *The Gater* newspaper at State. He also played tennis with some of the teachers there and he and Pat were peace activists. Their influence produced an entire family of teachers.

We know the Werthimers are thrilled to receive this honor from their children, spouses, their three grandchildren and ITHA.
